QUESTION 1 (16 Marks)

In Mariah (1993), Che Husna Azhari writes about the reality of her own culture: The Malay culture.

In your response:

- a) Examine TWO (2) gender issues that are emphasized in the short story. (10 marks)
- b) Discuss how the author explores the cultural and religious beliefs of Malay society through the character, the Imam. (6 marks)

QUESTION 2 (16 Marks)

Shirley Geok-lin Lim explores postcolonial themes in her works such as *Mr. Tang's Girls* (1997) and *Riding into California* (1998).

In your response:

- a) Based on *Mr. Tang's Girls*, discuss the theme of identity that is portrayed in the short story. (10 marks)
- b) Based on *Riding into California*, discuss the theme of identity that is portrayed in the poem as shown in Text 1. (6 marks)
