**QUESTION 1**

**(12 Marks)**

One of the main theories in relation to language, society and culture is Vygotsky's Social Interactionist Theory.

In your response:

- a) Discuss Vygotsky's Social Interactionist Theory. (6 marks)
- b) Illustrate **THREE (3)** real-life examples of how social and cultural environments affect linguistic diversity of English speakers as proposed by Vygotsky. (6 marks)

**QUESTION 2**

**(14 Marks)**

Language genesis refers to the spontaneous creation of new languages.

In your response:

- a) Compare and contrast superstrate and substrate languages. (8 marks)
- b) Compare and contrast pidgins and creoles. (6 marks)

**QUESTION 3**

**(10 Marks)**

The Whorfian Hypothesis can be understood by considering two opposing positions: Weak and strong claims.

In your response:

- a) Discuss the weak claim of the hypothesis. Provide **ONE (1)** example to further strengthen your answer. (5 marks)
- b) Discuss the strong claim of the hypothesis. Provide **ONE (1)** example to further strengthen your answer. (5 marks)

**QUESTION 4**

**(14 Marks)**

Speakers use different language styles according to the social contexts that they are in.

In your response:

- a) Describe **THREE (3)** factors that influence a speaker's level of formality in communicating with another individual. (6 marks)
- b) Compare and contrast the **TWO (2)** different language styles employed by colleagues in different settings as shown in Figure 1. (8 marks)
