SECTION A (20 Marks)

The following passage contains **TEN (10)** common writing errors. Identify all the errors and write the appropriate corrections.

Next to the riot of colour that characterise its most famous games, Nintendo's HQ is conspicuously bland: two mid-rise white buildings in close proximity a half-hour's walk from Kyoto's central station, a grey Nintendo logo outside each. A small basket of Mario plush toys is the only clue as to what's made in this building on the receptionist's desk. Perhaps it's more interesting-looking upstairs, that's a mystery to anyone who doesn't work here. As I am firmly but politely told when I ask if there's any chance of a tour, *nobody* goes up there.

I am here to meet Shigeru Miyamoto, the most influential game designer in the world. He is best known for the creation of Mario, but he is also responsible for several of Nintendo's other hit games – among them The Legend of Zelda, whose latest instalment just topped many of 2023's game of the year lists. He have been involved in the design of all of the company's consoles, from 1983's Famicom (known outside Japan as the Nintendo Entertainment System) to its latest, the 130m-selling Nintendo Switch. Since 1977, when Miyamoto joined the company. Nintendo has sold more than 1bn copies of games featuring his creations. He is the architect of several generations' worth of childhood dreams.

After the past decade or so of countless gaming conventions and promotional videos, Miyamoto has pulled back from the spotlight. He doesn't often do interviews and our meeting today has taken more than a year to arranged. Given the way he is talked about by other Nintendo creatives I've interviewed over the years, you get the impression of him as a revered creative older, ready to pass judgment or rare praise – rather more intimidated than the smiling image we see on stage.

In person, though, Miyamoto is welcoming and full of enthusiasm, though more reserved than you might expect from the world's most famous game designer. He does not love the spotlight. After his photoshoot, where he poses enthusiastically with a Mario soft toy, he tell me that he's never much liked being in front of a camera, despite his talent at performing for one.

SECTION B (30 Marks)

Your writing partner completed the initial draft of a thesis-led argumentative essay, and submitted it to the lecturer for review. Your lecturer has returned the draft with feedback.

Using **ONLY** the notes provided, write the suggested corrections to the essay in order to refine it. Write your answers as a numbered list, with each answer clearly labelled.

You do not need to add or delete any content apart from what is required in the notes.

Ask any working Malaysian if they could imagine having only eight or nine public holidays a year, and you would be likely to receive an outcry of epic proportions. However, that is precisely the situation for the people of the United Kingdom. By comparison, Malaysia has an average of 23 to 25 public holidays a year. (1)

To begin with, having that many days off allows Malaysians to share in each other's cultures and traditions. The unique multiculturalism that has characterised our country since its founding is usually the reason cited for so many public holidays. (2) In her 2023 Christmas greetings on social media for example, Federal Territories minister in the Prime Minister's department, Dr Zaliha Mustafa wrote, "we need to value every uniqueness and tradition without abandoning the value of unity that has been with us all this while" (3) News Straits Times, 2023b.

In addition, Malaysians already are among the most overworked people in the world, as was discovered in 2022, where Kuala Lumpur ranked as the third most overworked city in the world, after Dubai and Hong Kong ("KL world's 3rd", 2022). Part of the reason attributed to such a result is "cultural values", where "employees who desire work-life balance might sometimes be labelled as 'lazy' or 'unambitious" (Ooi, 2023). (4) In fact, in 2018, "mental health conditions in the workplace cost the Malaysian economy an estimated RM14.46 billion" (Bernama, 2023a). So it would be ill-advised to take away good reasons for employees who already have poor work-life balance to take time off.

Critics often point out that our numerous public holidays are very disruptive to day-to-day business, which inevitably slows down trade and the economy. Even workers should

(5 marks) not be overjoyed since, as Parti Bumi Kenyalang president, Voon Lee Shan was reported as commenting, "at the end of the day, they will find goods and services more expensive as costs incurred by business owners will be shared by them" (5) (Lim, APRIL 20 2023). (6) Our regular "45-hour work weeks and two weeks of annual leave" must surely count for something, as opposed to a country like Australia with "33-hour weeks and a month's annual leave" (Bernama, 2023a).

In sum, Malaysians should not be ashamed of the number of public holidays we have since it affords us a way to celebrate each other, and a way to seek recreation without having to sacrifice leave or be made to feel guilty for nothing. Claiming a loss of productivity is a poor and quite unfair critique of our people who already work very hard – maybe even overly hard – when there is no holiday at hand. (7)


