 - iii. Sophocles' 'Oedipus Rex': A tragic hero who committed patricide. (6 marks)

QUESTION 2 (12 Marks)

In the present day, Greek mythology is still influential in several areas.

In your response:

- a) Discuss the Greek hero, Achilles in terms of:
 - i. His origin story. (8 marks)
 - ii. How he is used as a reference in modern popular culture. (4 marks)

QUESTION 3 (20 Marks)

Odysseus and Heracles are TWO (2) prominent heroic figures in Greek mythology.

In your response:

- a) Discuss **TWO (2)** themes in the *Odyssey*, in which Odysseus is the main character. (10 marks)
- b) Discuss Heracles' '12 Labours' by using **THREE (3)** stages of the labours. (10 marks)
